Faculty, Staff and Students

1. Is everyone who is on campus required to wear a mask?
2. What should I do if people around me are not wearing a mask and I feel uncomfortable?
3. I don't have a mask. Where do I obtain a mask?
4. I have a health condition where I can't wear a mask. What should I do?
5. Will student athletic teams practice and compete in the fall?
6. Will we be asked to perform self-health screenings, and if so, what does that entail?
7. If I test positive for COVID-19, when can I return to campus?
8. If someone on campus tests positive for the virus, will I be notified?
9. Who do I tell if I test positive for COVID-19?
10. At what point, or threshold, would the campus be closed if there are positive tests?
11. Given that the Governor has now allowed 75% occupancy, how does this impact seating in areas such as the cafeteria, the library, and the hot spot?
12. How many feet of social distancing is expected in all buildings on campus?
13. How many people are allowed in an elevator at the same time?
14. Will "one way" walking be expected in any areas (ex: certain hallways or stairwells)?
15. Will there be limitations on how many people can gather for events on campus?
